



Alison Roberts - Welsh learner of the year 2023

Welsh learner Alison Roberts shares her journey of learning Welsh and explains the the language's importance in health and social care.

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Alison Roberts is originally from Perthshire in Scotland. She works in health and social care and lives on Anglesey with her husband Siôn and seven children.

In 2023, Alison won the Welsh learner of the year award at the National Eisteddfod. Here's her story about why she learned Welsh and why she thinks it's important that people who use health, care and support services are able to communicate in Welsh.

I come from Scotland, and the
Gaelic language is almost dead.

If you go into someone's house
and their first language is Welsh,

I've had a positive response from people and
they're so pleased I've

learnt Welsh and it's a big deal for them, you
can see their eyes

widen and they say, "what, really?"

Yes, people are just proud and happy.

I remember once I was working on shift for Betsi

to be going home that day

so an English speaking nurse

went to tell him "you're not going home today."

And then they asked me to go in and explain to him why he wasn't going home,

And just think, if someone who spoke his

I think, just go for it.

As I say to people I meet,

I still have problems with mutations and things like that,

that I still can't get my head round.

But it doesn't matter, I'm still able to have
conversations with people every day.

I'd like to see myself still going back into the community,

because it's really important for me

to try and get more people in health and social care

It's important for me to be an inspiration
